164	<b>Receiver’s Turnaround Plan Proposal</b>	Assembly -\$144,500
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**Governor** proposed \$235 million in 2010-11 to support 19 IT projects currently being implemented by the federally court-appointed Receiver.

Senate -\$25,000
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**Assembly** reduced this proposal by a total of \$144.5 million to reflect (1) \$45.6 million in IT funding already included in the Receiver’s budget, and (2) a reduction of \$98.9 million to prioritize infrastructure projects and those designed to reduce operational costs.

Difference \$119,500
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**Senate** reduced this proposal by \$25 million.
