Every year, California spends billions of public dollars on projects that maintain our infrastructure and support the transition to a more sustainable future. **But many of these projects leave workers out of the equation, creating low-quality manufacturing jobs with poor wages and insufficient benefits**. Jobs to Move America works to leverage the power of public spending to create jobs that sustain families, support communities, and create opportunity across California.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Massive state and federal investments in manufacturing projects are set to create more resilient and sustainable communities. Now, state lawmakers have the opportunity to decide the way that many of these funds will be spent. Current public procurement processes often fail to take job quality into consideration, allowing companies to reduce prices at the expense of workers. However, proven strategies, such as the U.S. Employment Plan, have been successful in bringing high-quality manufacturing jobs to local communities without significantly impacting competition or cost.
