<b>AB 110</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Budget</b> <i>Enacts the 2011-12 state budget. (Successor to SB 69 and AB 98, both of which were vetoed on June 16.)</i>	<b>SB 87</b>
<b>AB 108</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Public Safety Realignment #1: VLF Financing</b> <i>Provides \$453 million billion in VLF funding to pay for a portion of Public Safety Realignment: (1) VLF funds redirected from administration of Department of Motor Vehicles (\$300 million, with corresponding \$12 increase in motor vehicle registration fees), and (2) VLF funds that can be redirected from local governments (\$153 million).</i>	<b>SB 89</b>
<b>AB 114</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Education Trailer</b> <i>Makes various statutory changes to K-12, higher education, and child care programs that are necessary to implement provisions of the 2011-12 budget. Includes \$1.8 billion in Prop. 98 "triggered" cuts, if revenues are below projections by \$2 billion or more.</i>	<b>SB 91</b>
<b>AB 116</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Public Safety Trailer</b> <i>Makes various statutory changes to public safety and correctional programs that are necessary to implement provisions of the 2011-12 budget, including the creation of a Board of Community Corrections.</i>	<b>SB 92</b>
<b>AB 118</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Public Safety Realignment #2: Sales Tax Financing and Allocations</b> <i>Converts \$5 billion in state sales tax to local sales tax to pay for Public Safety Realignment program. Provides for allocations of the funding for the various public safety programs. Implements AB 109 (passed in March).</i>	<b>SB 93</b>

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<b>AB 117</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Public Safety Realignment #3: AB 109 Clean-up</b>	<b>SB 95</b>
		<i>Makes various technical changes to provisions of AB 109 passed in March.</i>	
<b>AB 121</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>"Trigger" Expenditure Reductions</b>	<b>SB 96</b>
		<i>Provides DOF with authority to make up to \$2.5 billion in additional expenditure reductions, should revenue collections fall short of projections in December 2011.</i>	
<b>A 101</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>"Trigger" Provisions Related to Health and Human Services</b>	<b>SB 73</b>
		<i>Makes various statutory changes needed to implement \$200 million in HHS reductions that are part of the \$2.5 billion in "trigger" cuts.</i>
