Subject: Budget Act of 2025

Summary: This bill is a Budget Bill Junior and increases a General Fund appropriation in the Budget Act of 2025 to support a grant program for family planning providers.

Proposed Law: This bill amends the Budget Act of 2025 as follows:

- 1) Increases General Fund expenditure authority for the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) by \$90 million to support grants for family planning providers.
- 2) Requires HCAI to, in consultation with the California Health and Human Services Agency (CalHHS), determine the methodology and distribution of the grant funds to family planning providers.
- 3) Providers eligible for grant funds are community clinics that provide family planning and family planning-related services and are subject to an elimination of federal financial participation on or after July 4, 2025.
- 4) Authorizes up to \$1.5 million to be used for state operations for administration of the grant program.

Fiscal Effect: Increases General Fund expenditure authority for the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) by \$90 million to support grants for family planning providers.
